Billy Dye (Embassy Suites) – Welcome to Embassy Suites, we're glad to have you are here! We have a lot of new staff on board -- you've all already met my Assistant General Manager, Shuki, and our Sales Team, Bernadette and Memory, Evangeli is our Banquet Captain. We are pretty much back in full operation. Our restaurant Blossom Bar & Grill is open every day 5:00 -10:30 p.m. We are getting ready to reintroduce room service within the next few weeks. We change our menu seasonally, we will be switching to a summer menu at the end of May. Our pool is open morning to night and our fitness center is open 24 hours since restrictions have been lifted. We do complimentary breakfast every morning for our guests, we do an evening reception as well from 5:00 -6:30 p.m. We offer draft beer, well cocktails, and some wines are complimentary for guests. Aside from that, we have a full operating bar. Our restaurant is now on Yelp and anyone can eat at our restaurant, it's not just for guests. We have a show room available - if anyone would like to take a tour after lunch, Bernadette will be giving a tour.

### **TOURISM OFFICE UPDATES**

#### • 2022 Collateral

The 2022 Visitor Guides are now available. Evan and I dropped off boxes to the Tourism Marketing District hotels yesterday. If you need more let us know. The new Visit Santa Clarita rack cards are also now available and are displayed at our hotels, John Wayne, Ontario and Burbank airports, and racks throughout the Los Angeles area.

### • Summer Trolley

O As usual, it is planned for the trolley to run from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend (May 27 – September 11). It will pick up guests from several of the Tourism Marketing District hotels and drop off/pick up guests at the designated Six Flags spot in the mornings and evenings. Currently working on our printed collateral as well as signage which should be going up in the next month or so.

### • Santa Clarita Go!

o Justis Guardia is with our City's Transit Division and is here to talk about Santa Clarita Go! which is the transit version of ride share. We see this as a huge benefit to the city and our visitors, so we are hoping people take advantage of this service. Justis Guardia (City of Santa Clarita Transit Division) – Our program Go! Santa Clarita is the equivalent of Uber/Lyft and run by public transit. We just expanded the service area and now service the entire City. Anyone can download the Trip Shot app to request one of our vehicles and get a ride to anywhere in the City for \$2. You can also get connected to the Metrolink stations -- you can get anywhere in the city pretty easily. Anyone can get a ride in the city for \$2 (full fare) or \$1 (reduced fare). As of now, families or groups can take a trip (get picked up and dropped off at the same location) for just one fare currently, but hopefully as ridership and demands increases that will be limited to each paying guest will have 2 free guests accompany them. Also, for SENSES on April 21st we will be extending our hours so SENSES attendees can use the service to get there and also get home. We can handle heavy demand, we currently have about a 15-minute wait time. Most days we have two vehicles parked on either side of the city, so we are close to anyone who calls. We haven't had a problem with anyone waiting an extended period of time or not having enough vehicles. Vehicles have 12 seats, so it should be able to hold a group of 12.

Upcoming events: April 16: annual Eggstravaganza, with about 1,000 kids at Central Park running around and getting Easter eggs. It's one of biggest and shortest events, it will start at 10:00 a.m. and is over by 10:01 a.m.! If you have anything you would like to put in the eggs let me know, we are stuffing eggs as we speak, so if there are any coupons or specials you'd like to add let me know. April 21: is SENSES Block Party on Main Street in Old Town Newhall. This month will be Western-themed. April 23: Party on the Point (POP) which is a brand-new, one-time event. We had our first one last week, which was Polynesian themed. About 800 people attended - it was a great turn out and was super exciting. The next one will be celebrating our Sister Cities in the Philippines, Ecuador, Japan, and China. 4th of July parade, run, and fireworks will be happening. That will lead us into Concerts in the Park which starts July 9<sup>th</sup>.
